KERALA GOVT. SIGNS MoU WITH VSSC TO DEVELOP SPACE PARK



In a major boost to the Kerala Space Park project, Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) has recently signed an MoU with the State Government to support its endeavours promoting Space Technology vertical in the State.

The agreement was signed by M Sivasanakar IAS, Secretary, Department of Electronics & IT and S Somanath, Director, VSSC in the presence of Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan. “With VSSC and the Kerala Government joining hands for the project, the State is set to make major strides in space technology sector. This partnership will create an ideal ambiance for advanced research and development in the field of space technology,” the Chief Minister said.

The agreement will facilitate VSSC to support the State’s ambitious project to set up the country’s first state-of-the-art Space Systems Park at Knowledge City in the State capital to attract

global startups in the space sector and make it a major manufacturing hub for space-related technology, research and development. “This agreement will enable to tap the full potential of Kerala in space research. The Space Park will also generate plenty of job opportunities,” Somanath said.

Technopark will transfer 20.01 acres of land on lease to the Kerala State Information Technology Infrastructure Ltd. (KSITIL) to develop Space Park at the Knowledge City within the Technocity. Dr. A P J Abdul Kalam Knowledge Centre and Space Museum, to be developed by VSSC as a befitting memorial to the former President and top space scientist, will be part of the overall infrastructure of the Space Park.

Tom Jose IAS, Chief Secretary; M C Dathan, Scientific Advisor to the Chief Minister; S Chithra IAS, Director, IT Mission; Dr. D Sam Dayala Dev, Director, ISRO Inertial Systems Unit;

Dr. V Narayanan, Director, LPSC; Dr. Santhosh Kurup, Special Officer, Space Park; Hrishikesh Nair, CEO, IT Parks Kerala and senior scientists from VSSC attended the ceremony.

Through the MoU, VSSC will support Kerala Space Park in technical and leadership responsibility and help promote the SMEs, startups and other partner entities in developing products and services for the Space Industry. Kerala Space Park will join hands with VSSC in organising international events and attract global space companies to Kerala.

Kerala Space Park has two sub verticals – Space Technology Application Development Ecosystem (STADE) and Nano Space Park to harness both upstream and downstream capabilities of Space Tech domain. STADE has already signed agreements with French Space Agency CNES and also Airbus, for promotion of Space and Aerospace Startups.

CLEAN TECHNOLOGY BANDWAGON MOVES ON

At a time when electric vehicles are drawing the attention of everyone, I feel much empowered to write about ‘clean technology’ as mine would be the first official vehicle under Kerala Government to make the switch to electric mobility. This comes close on the heels of two major initiatives that our Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan has taken in the State. The first is the intent of the Government to roll-out one million e-vehicles by 2022. These include 3 000 buses, 100 ferries, 200,000 two-wheelers, 50,000 three-wheelers and 1000 goods carriers besides 8000 e-autos.

The second one is the inauguration of the State’s first electric vehicle charging station at Edapally in Kochi, by the Chief Minister. Power Grid Corporation of India has provided the basic facilities for the initiative. Those planning

a transition to electric vehicles have more reason to cheer as the Union Budget has announced an income tax deduction of Rs. 1,50,000 on interest paid on loans taken for the purchase of e-vehicles, without considering the class or cost of such vehicles. With much being done to stimulate the supply and demand of electric vehicles, the market is ripe for such vehicles.

To all young minds being groomed in the engineering and other technical educational institutions of Kerala, I would like to say that this is your opportunity to come out and make a difference. Why not come up with a portable and low-cost pump that can help e-vehicles check pollution?
